RULES AND PROCEDURES

- 1. Applicants are to be children, grandchildren, or spouses of members in good standing, which are active or retired and children of a previously active deceased members of Sheet Metal Worker's Local #219.
- 2. Applicants must be presently enrolled and expecting to graduate from an area high school, or presently a <u>full-time</u> college or technical student.
- 3. To receive a scholarship offered, the applicant must be attending, or planning to attend a college or technical school as a <u>full-time</u> student. The scholarship shall be applied to the ensuing academic year for tuition, room and board, books, or other related expenses.
- 4. All completed applications must be post marked or delivered to the address listed below by **Friday, April 21, 2023.**

Original application forms are to be used.

It is preferred the applications be type written, however neatly, hand printed applications will be considered.

- 5. Applicants shall have a current GPA of at least 2.5, on a 4.0 scale. Applications are to include one (1) letter of recommendation from a non-family member, (clergy, teacher, counselor, etc.), a copy of high school and/or college transcripts, and a copy of their most current report card.
- 6. <u>Winners will be notified by letter. The applicant and/or the Member MUST be present</u> to accept the check at the July Union Meeting (July 25, 2023). If not present you will forfeit your scholarship award.
- 7. Last year there were 38 \$1,500 scholarships award.


